Cupertino Minimum Wage to Increase on January 1, 2018 Learn more at www.cupertino.org/wagewatch

In September, the City Manager certified that current economic conditions support the next scheduled minimum wage increase to \$13.50 on January 1, 2018. Per Section 3.37.040 (f) of the Cupertino Municipal Code, this determination was made based on the change in state unemployment rate and sales and use tax(SUT) revenues. As reported by the California Employment Development Department, there was a slight decline in the unemployment rate for the 3-month and 6-month periods ending in June 2017 of -0.2 percentage points and -0.5 percentage points, respectively. The Department of Finance reported a 2.7% increase in state SUT revenue in FY 2017 compared to FY 2016.

Official Minimum Wage Notices will be sent to all business license holders in Cupertino on or before December 1, 2017. The City has also updated its www.cupertino.org/wagewatch page with information on the upcoming increase.



EMPLOYEES:

- · Starting January 1, 2018 minimum wage in Cupertino is \$13.50/hour.
- · Minimum wage rate will be adjusted annually on January 1.
- · Covered employees include anyone who performs 2 hours or more of work per week in Cupertino.
- · Covered employees are entitled to these rights regardless of immigration status.
