



## Evacuating Cupertino Zone CUP-E013

This map is intended to serve as a planning resource, not a guide when you are in the process of evacuating.

Plan for yourself and your household ahead of time. If you believe that you will require additional time to evacuate, treat an evacuation warning as an order and leave as soon as possible. If you feel that you are in danger, do not wait to be told to evacuate. Share your evacuation plans with neighbors, your community, and family. Share vehicles with neighbors when evacuating, if possible, to reduce road congestion. If an evacuation is ordered, routes and temporary evacuation points as well as specific instructions may be provided by public safety agencies through the AlertSCC system.

**ZONE DESCRIPTION:** Zone Cup-E013 is located south of Junipero Serra Freeway/ Interstate 280, and includes only the commercial area of the Apple campus. Zone Cup-E013 does not include residential areas.

**ROUTE DESCRIPTIONS:** Visitors may exit Zone Cup-E013 to the north along N De Anza Boulevard, or may use N De Anza Boulevard to access Junipero Serra Freeway/ Interstate 280 from the northern part of the zone. Residents and visitors may leave Zone Cup-E013 to the south using S Stelling Road or S De Anza Boulevard heading towards Saratoga. Visitors may exit Zone Cup-E013 to the south along S De Anza Boulevard. If Zone Cup-E013 evacuates, specific routes may be specified by public safety officials.
