



Evacuating Cupertino Zone CUP-E019

This map is intended to serve as a planning resource, not a guide when you are in the process of evacuating.

Plan for yourself and your household ahead of time. If you believe that you will require additional time to evacuate, treat an evacuation warning as an order and leave as soon as possible. If you feel that you are in danger, do not wait to be told to evacuate. Share your evacuation plans with neighbors, your community, and family. Share vehicles with neighbors when evacuating, if possible, to reduce road congestion. If an evacuation is ordered, routes and temporary evacuation points as well as specific instructions may be provided by public safety agencies through the AlertSCC system.

ZONE DESCRIPTION: Zone Cup-E019 is a residential zone which extends west from the West Valley Freeway/ State Route State Route 85 to Blackberry Farm Park and McClellan Ranch Preserve. McClellan Road makes up the southern Border of Zone Cup-E019 and Stevens Creek Boulevard makes up the northern Border. Zone Cup-E019 includes the Home of Christ Church in Cupertino.

ROUTE DESCRIPTIONS: There multiple ways out of Zone Cup-E019. Routes most likely to be used head east, north, or south from the zone, away from the foothills. Residents and visitors may exit Zone Cup-E019 to the east along Stevens Creek Boulevard, to the east along McClellan Road, or to the south along Bubb Road towards Saratoga. From Stevens Creek Boulevard heading east residents and visitors may access State Route State Route 85 headed northbound or southbound. If Zone Cup-E019 evacuates, specific routes may be specified by public safety officials. Register to receive emergency alerts for information in an emergency at AlertSCC.org.
