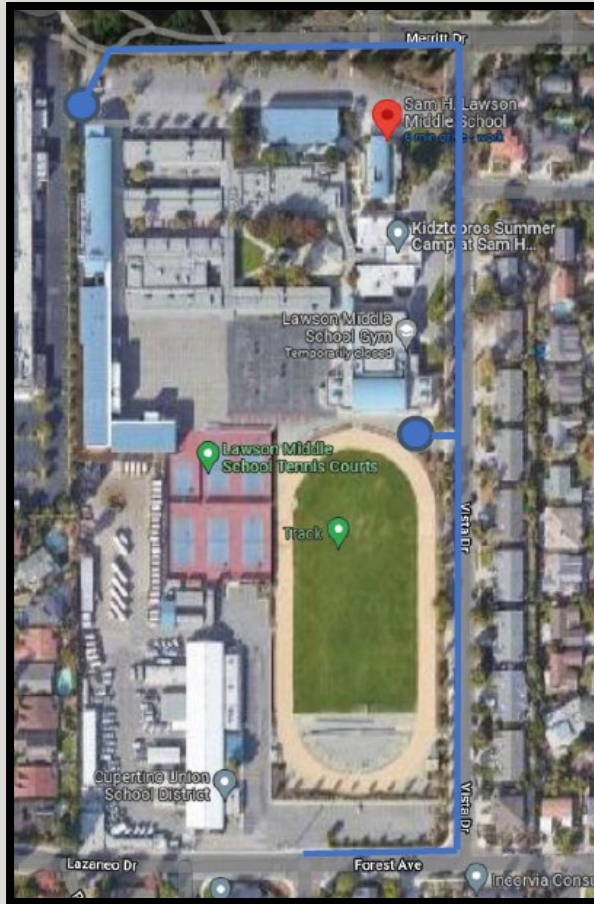


New Separated Bikeway at Kennedy

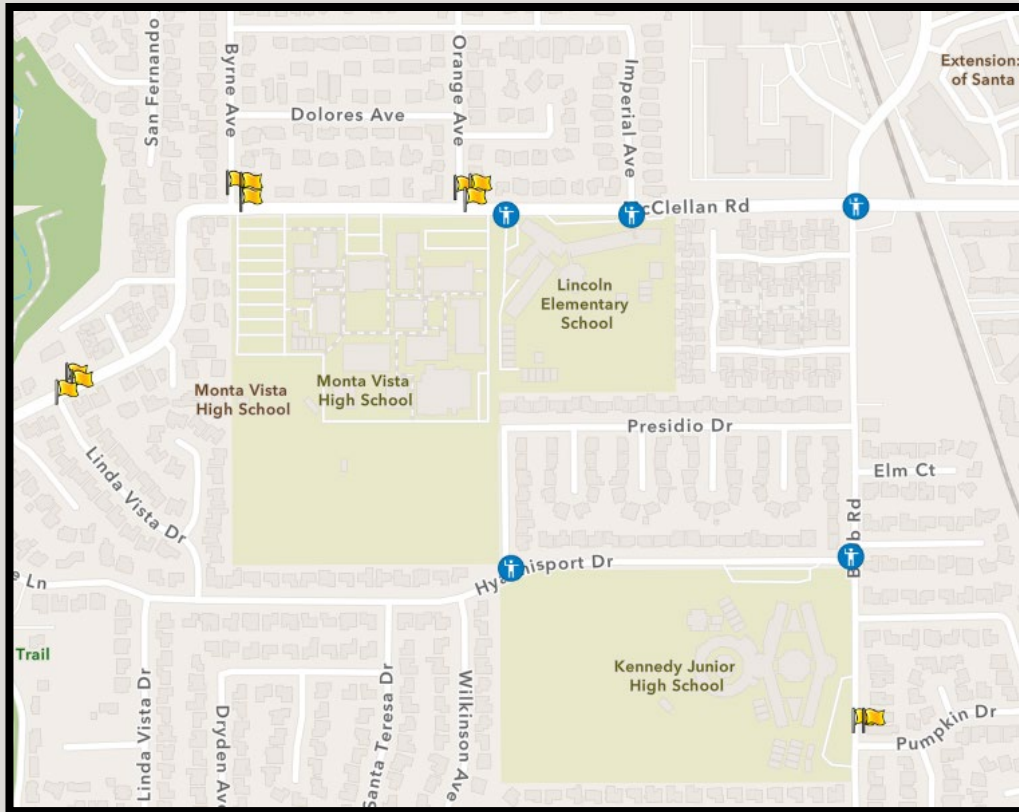

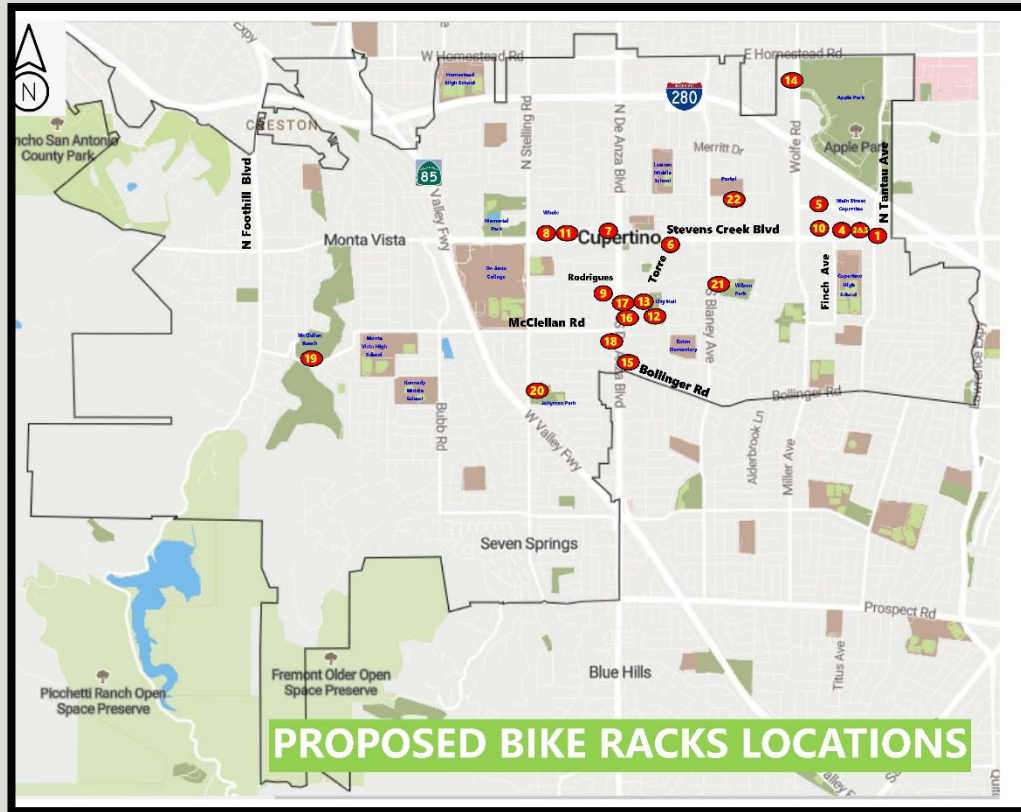


Tri-School Area Observations

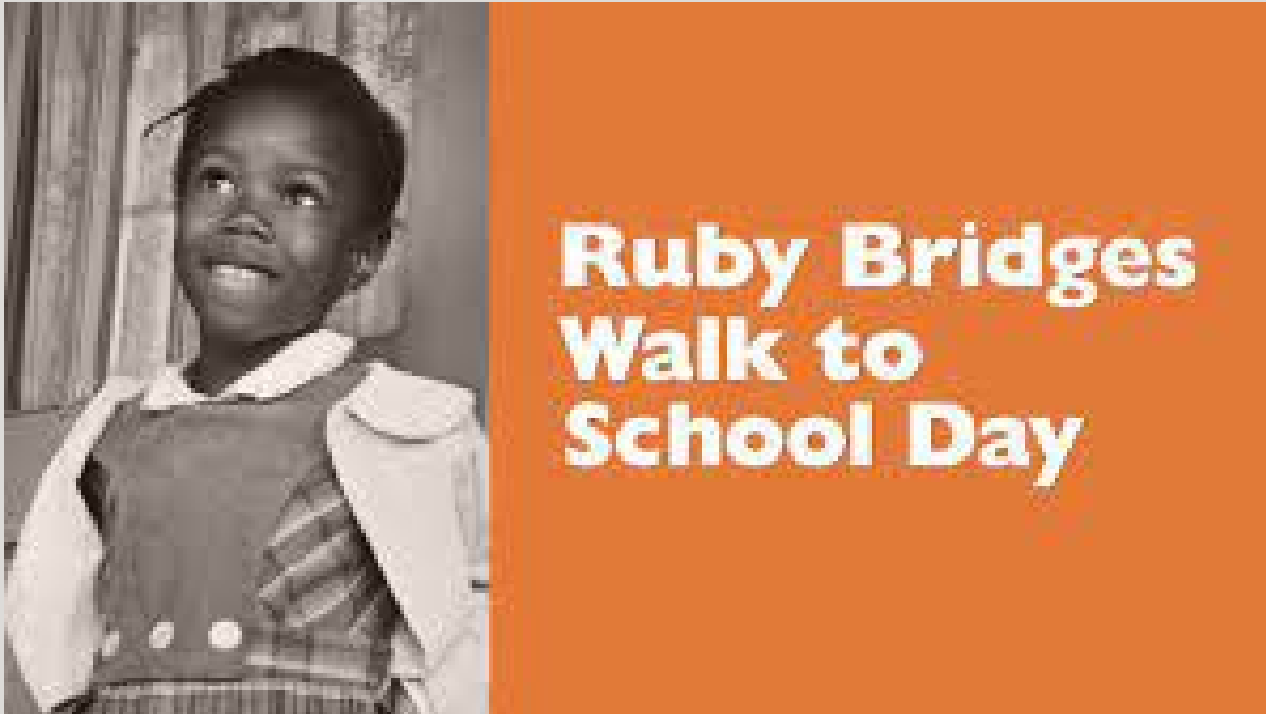


