Roadmap for a Better Vallco and a Better Cupertino

1. PAUSE BAD OPTION

Referendum the recently approved 2018 mega Valloo Specific Plan to put it to a public vote by 2020 or earlier through a special election, at Council's discretion. [Sign the petition by Oct. 28]

. BETTER LEADERSHIP

Elect sensible City Council members, like Liang Chao and 3on Willey, who would hold the developers and city staff accountable for their actions.

. HOLD DEVELOPER ACCOUNTABLE

The Council directs the staff to seriously follow all city and state laws on the SB 35 project if Developer wishes to go forward. Either the compliance issue will be called into question or the developer work be able to profit. Thus, Developer will be open to a better Valico plan.

4. BETTER VALLCO

Re-start the community process to come up with a better and reasonable Valico plan under a reasonable City Council, who will only accept reasonably-sized plan that meet community needs and improve housing shortage without overwhelming traffic and other infrastructure.
