Parks and Recreation Updates

On January 25, the State of California lifted the regional-Stay-Home-Order sending Santa Clara County back to the Purple Tier of the of the State's Blueprint for a Safer Economy. The City of Cupertino's Parks and Recreation Department has updated its usage requirements for playgrounds, picnic sites, tennis courts, Blackberry Farm Golf Course, and individual and group athletic field use.
