What Does the County's "Shelter in Place" Order Mean?

 Today, Santa Clara County—along with six other jurisdictions—announced a new order directing individuals to shelter at home except to provide or receive essential or engage in essential services. See the Frequently Asked Questions about this order here.

- Am I allowed to leave my home while this Order is in effect? The intent of this Order is to ensure that people remain in their residences and minimize social interactions outside of their immediate family unit. However, you may leave your residence for reasons specified in the Order. These reasons include ensuring the health and safety of yourself and your family, engaging in outdoor activity that does not involve close contact with other people, obtaining services and supplies for yourself and your family, and to perform employment functions that are permissible under the Order.
- O How will I get food and medicines I need if I must "shelter in place" in my home? The Order specifically allows people to leave their home to buy food, purchase medicine, and purchase other necessary items. It also encourages businesses selling those items to remain open, and allows employees of those businesses to keep working.
