Silicon Valley Community Choice Energy Partnership Meetings

On Friday, September 18, 2015 the Silicon Valley Community Choice Energy Partnership (SVCCEP) announced a series of community meetings to introduce residents to Community Choice Energy.

Community Choice Energy allows city and county governments to pool the electricity demand of their communities to buy greener sources of electricity on behalf of residents, businesses, and other public agencies in their jurisdictions. Shifting to greener energy sources through a Community Choice Energy program is the single most impactful action Silicon Valley communities can take to lowering greenhouse gas. In addition, a Community Choice Energy program may provide competitive electricity rate options and stimulating the local green economy. Community Choice Energy has been successful for rate payers and beneficial for the environment in communities that have implemented these programs.
