Cultures of the World: India and Mexico

The Parks and Recreation Department held its second Cultures of the World event, featuring India on Thursday, October 10 at the Quinlan Community Center with more than 50 attendees. The October family-friendly event showcased the Indian culture through art activities, traditional delicacies, history posters, music, and a live Rangoli performance. CUSD Schools Visit McClellan Ranch and Learn About Local Watersheds

This fall, eight third-grade CUSD schools visited McClellan Ranch to learn about local watersheds. Students observed and identified stonefly, mayfly, caddisfly, damselfly nymphs, and other aquatic invertebrates that play an important role in the Stevens Creek ecosystem. One lucky school encountered Doctor Jerry Smith, a biologist and SJSU professor, while he was conducting a survey with the California Department of Fish and Wildlife where they got to meet the steelhead trout they were counting and measuring. Overall, 1,106 students, parents, and teachers learned about creek life and watersheds this fall through Cupertino's Storm Drain Pollution Prevention Program. This program will resume in the spring when the remainder of CUSD 3rd-grade students visit McClellan Ranch Preserve.

FY 2019-20 First Quarter Report

The following is the First Quarter Financial Report, submitted by the Administrative Services Department for the period of July 1, 2019 to September 30, 2019 for the 2019-2020 Fiscal Year. It has been prepared to inform the City Council, City leadership and the public of the City's fiscal status.

Background

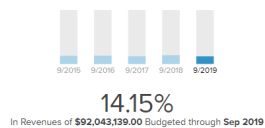
On June 18, 2019, the City Council adopted the Fiscal Year 2019-20 Adopted Budget for the City of Cupertino. This spending plan of **\$150,532,151** for all funds reflected a \$44.7M increase from the 2019-20 Proposed Budget of **\$105,792,061**. This is due to changes recommended by Council at the final budget hearing and adoption that include increases of \$31.4M for the Capital Improvement Plan, \$9.8M in Bike and Pedestrian Projects, and \$1.8M for a Community Shuttle program and \$1.1M for depreciation expenses. First quarter adjustments include carryovers and encumbrances for obligations from the previous fiscal year, as well as adjustments approved as part of any separate Council agenda item. Combined, these adjustments result in the amended operating budget of **\$203,058,692**.

General Fund Revenue and Expenditure Trends

As of September 30, 2019, General Fund expenditures are \$27.3 million; this represents 30% of the budgeted appropriations. Expenditures at the first quarter point of the prior three years ranged between 19% and 31% of the final actual expenditures which places current first quarter actuals within the range. Although expenditures appear to be on the higher end, this is primarily due to a change in methodology for recording all annual operating transfers in the first quarter. General Fund revenues are at \$13.0 million; this represents 14% of the budgeted revenue. Revenues at the first quarter point of the prior three years were between 14% and 21%, placing this year within the range. Staff will continue to monitor its leading revenue sources as the year progresses.

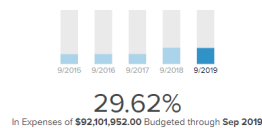
General Fund Revenues - First Quarter vs Budget

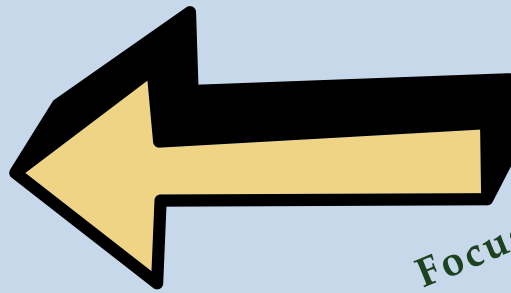
